- 1. Welcome and recognition of traditional territories
 - a. The George Jay Parent Advisory Council wishes to recognize and acknowledge the Esquimalt and Songhees Nations, on whose traditional territories, we live, we learn, and we do our work.

- 5. Principal's Report (Sarah)
 - a. The Naming Committee will provide an update next month. It likely won't have a new name by spring break.
 - b. Kindergarten Registration Currently 31 French and 27 English students are enrolled. Expecting 2 classes each.

- c. Hold and Secure Brief explanation of hold and secure. Ensures that no one goes in or out of the school but we maintain normal routines inside the school.
- d. Learning Twice a year teaching teams complete a school-wide write and assessment. The first is in progress and the second will take place in May.
- e. Code of Conduct Borrowing exercise from Willows to advance the kids' understanding. Will share the final product after spring break.
- f. Seeking feedback on learning through lunch Pre-pandemic grades 4 and 5s would help with lunchtime supervision. During the pandemic, they shifted to teachers staying in the class to read, etc. and shorter days. Sarah is seeking Any feedback from parents?
- g. Climbing wall is in transit. Should arrive in the next couple of weeks.
- h. Planning for 2022/23 school year Letter will be home soon asking if we anticipate returning to the school next year.
- COVID We may be in a new phase of the pandemic. Anticipate that restrictions will change on Friday. Expect to be able to hold assemblies and in-person meetings at up to 50% of capacity. Phase-out staggered recess but not expecting a removal of the mask mandate. Will be inviting more volunteers to the building. Will still take a cautious approach but slowly shift to an endemic. I will do it in a calculated way to support the student and staff committee
- j. Reminder to caregivers to not park in residential parking or in the roundabout. And please don't cut across the parking lot.

 - a. Indigo Love of Reading Foundation PAC exec drafted a letter
- 8. Treasurer's Report (Sam)
 - a. Wreath fundraiser PAC raised \$664.04 (80 wreaths and 35 swags sold). \$40 unaccounted for. Unlikely to find so we will just accept this as a loss.

 - i. Disbursed \$1995.95 to parent volunteer

 - a. Bylaw review The PAC Secretary is obligated to form a committee to review the bylaws every two years. Review and revisions were completed last school year (2020-2021). This year, the exec read through the bylaws and had no suggested updates.
 - b. Popcorn Game "Guess the Kernels" Reported success by admin, teachers, EAs and students. I would like to run a couple more of these low-cost, minimal efforts games. We have some potential ideas but welcome additional ideas.
