- h. Planning Grade 5 Dragon Boating. Booked but shhhh secret from kids.
- A neighbour at Princess/Chambers is attempting to create the world's largest Ukrainian flag out of flowers. Will be making it over a weekend on the school grounds.
- j. Clubs are up and running again. Run Club will be participating in the TC family run soon. Rugby will start for grades 4 and 5. Tentative confirmation for track for grades 4 and 5. Small choir for grade 5. And dance club on Wednesdays for all grades.
