- 1. **Meeting called to order** at 6:30pm. Welcome and recognition of traditional territories (Andrea)
- 2. Agenda amended to allow Naomi to present earlier.
- 3. Minutes of 10 March 2021 meeting accepted.
- 4. Equity and Diversity subcommittee report (Naomi) Subcommittee doing a lot of planning for next year. Map out opportunities for parent education that sync up with education events happening at school. Admin will provide EDI subcommittee with planned assemblies for next year to plan around. Last event for this year will happen in May coincident with Battle of the Books. Dave / Peach Cobblah will do a virtual drag queen storytime in support of reducing homo-, bi-, and trans-phobia. Attendees polled for best timeframe for 45 minute presentation. 7 votes 22 May (Sat) 10am-1pm, 6 votes 22 May 2-4pm, 5 votes 23 May (Sun) 10am-1pm, 3 votes 23 May 2-4pm.
- 5. Reports on previous action items
 - a. Advocacy letter for enhancing classroom support (Andrea) tabled until a future meeting to deal with budget cut advocacy (item 6)
 - b. Adding Angela's contact info to PAC website (Roberta) Done.
- 6. Large district budget cuts impact on George Jay support and admin staff (Leslie)
 - **District projects 7.1 million deficit**. Anger / frustration / worry for all parents. Devasting impact on work environment. Thank you to Exec and Angela to pulling together info. Shortfalls happening across the province. PAC needs to focus our energy on advocating. District asking for feedback.
 - Leslie summarized cuts and potential advocacy routes. See slides attached as an appendix to these minutes.

- Reasons for deficit include increased custodial, loss of international students, loss of facility rental fees but also appear to include a one-time change in accounting procedures / funding model (why do this year?).
- At George Jay, reduction in Community Link budget creating most impact. This funds Family Liaison, Youth/Family Counseling, and part of our Vice Principal (VP) position. Losing Leila Durzi (Family Liaison) and much of our VP position. Community link funding based on vulnerability rating from district. Our vulnerability rating projected to decrease from 76% to 73.04%. School's community link funding pays for meals first then rest is personnel. Other cuts to Early Childhood Educator, will impact kindies with high needs.
- First Nations educators and counselors will now be budgeted directly from district and assigned from there. George Jay can expect to receive some of their time still. George Jay has highest indigenous population after Craigflower, so we should get some district time back, but unclear how much.
- Some reductions in VP time and library come from reduction in student numbers from previous levels of over 500 to 455 this year and similar next year. School will not lose EA time. There could even be future opportunity to add to EA funding depending on student demographics next year.
- Music cuts are devastating. Middle school band would be moved from its own separate program to an "exploratory" on a rotation with others for 12 weeks. Music would not be cancelled but would not be at all the same quality experience.
- Question re: typical VP time at other schools. Elementary schools under 300 students have no VP. 300-500 students get 0.1 VP. Above 500 students get 0.2 VP. Middle and High Schools are losing VP time as well.
- Opportunity to provide feedback: 5 board working sessions to understand budget impact. Unclear if these are open to public. 21 Apr public info session.
- Advocacy options: e-mail campaign. VCPAC sent out a template that could be adapted.
 PAC and caregivers to present to board. Short punchy presentations. Media coverage. Need to put pressure on specific trustees but include all. Rob Paynter, Diane McNally, Nicole Duncan, and Anne Whiteaker most supportive of avoiding these drastic cuts. Paynter will introduce motion to instead rollover this year's budget, though this will create larger deficit in future years.
- Effective advocacy strategy: Advocate for increased Community Link funding rather than specific position. Emphasize equity. Use Sam's demographic info. Perhaps PAC can give stats overview and then have parents speak to individual issues. Need to create stories. In advocating for Leila's need to maintain level of confidentiality. We can't ask our most marginalized population to be frontline fighters on this.
- Reports that Ministry intends \$243 million increase to provincial district budgets, but effect on individual districts unclear. Part of our advocacy should be at provincial level.
- Plan to form a group to work on this advocacy. Please contact <u>georgejaypacsec@gmail.com</u> to get involved. *Motion to allow the PAC to advocate around proposed district budget cuts.* Roberta motions. Andrea seconds. Motion carries (30 yes, 0 no).

- Funding to facilitate outdoor education (Mel Cullins) Last fall many teachers asked for yoga mats to be used for sitting outdoors. Mel organized donations from several sources. However, need remains high among teachers, especially as weather is improving and case counts are climbing. *Motion to spend up to \$500 on mats that classrooms can use for sitting outdoors*. Melanie moves. Matthew Payne seconds. Motion carries (26 yes, 0 no).
- 8. Secretary's Report (Roberta)
 - a. Annual General Meeting coming up next month in which a new Exec will be elected. Bylaws require arms-length nomination officers to handle nomination and election. Motion to approve Matthew Payne as Nominating Officer and Karla Marshall as backup Nominating Officer for the 2021-22 Executive elections. Roberta moves. Rozee seconds. Motion carries (28 yes, 0 no).
- 9. Renaming committee update (Angela) Terms of reference have been passed and sent to PAC mailing list. April 7 committee meeting featured 2 speakers. First speaker was Lorliee Westescoot, a Cree woman, who addressed reconciliation and connected George Jay (the man) with the mistreatment of First Nations peoples. Second speaker was Dr. Timothy Stanley, whose research focuses strongly on George Jay. He strongly argued that George Jay was a white supremacist who personally involved himself in conflicts with Chinese students. Dr. Stanley would likely be willing to address a PAC meeting. Committee is planning a new survey of community. In last survey, many wanted to know what the new name would be before deciding on renaming. Question on whether decision to rename has already been made. No, committee's role is to recommend to district whether to rename. Suggestion made for a special meeting of the PAC to consider support for renaming, in order to give full hearing to the issues. Question on how PAC members can receive information from the committee. Action item for Angela: write up a summary of each meeting to send to PAC members. Also, members should read materials already sent out. Question on whether people outside the committee can watch the presentations? Privacy concerns prevent this. Committee's role is to produce a final recommendation report. Angela needs the PAC's direction on how to represent them in that final **recommendation.** Angela to ask for a meeting / agenda item on this when the time comes.
- 10. VCPAC awards (Angela) Request to think about student/staff/volunteers that have gone above and beyond and nominate them for VCPAC awards. Let's honour the hard work in SD61 and George Jay, especially in this stressful year. Deadline is 9 May. More info on VCPAC awards at <u>https://www.vcpac.ca/vcpac-awards</u>
- 11. School Streets pilot summary (Kate) Huge success closing Queens Ave 6-9 April facilitating families and kids walking/cycling to school. Combined school walked 460 km! Overwhelming positive feedback, though a few issues have been raised that the active transportation group will consider for next time. Please send additional feedback. City (police and transportation) and school admin were so helpful. Requests from parents for another closure of Queens in June. <u>Action item: Kate to put together final report.</u> *Motion to*

move forward with School Street program as ongoing PAC project. Andrea moves. Kate seconds. Motion carries (19 yes, 0 no).

- 12. Principal's Report (Melanie)
 - Walking 460 km has been great for geography lessons across the school.
 - Student population decreasing. Next year expect 2 fewer English divisions but remaining at 8 French divisions. Total = 24 divisions. Now working on staffing assignments. Filling learning support positions by 28 Apr. Will then post empty positions. Other schools losing population too. Empty classrooms will be repurposed. Mme. Moore's classroom (old music room) most urgent to become a different purpose (no sink). Further decisions made by staff discussion.
 - Sarah Winkler to become Principal next year. Mel moving to Marigold Elementary. Bittersweet. Mel, you will be missed.
- 13. Treasurer's Report (Zeta) submitted as a written report due to lateness of meeting.
 - 50/50 Raffle Nexus: \$5,277.06 = Total sales as of today; \$2,995.22 = Expenses and payout to winners; \$2,281.84 = Profit. We did not bring in as much as projected
 - Spring Grab bags: \$943.00 = received in donations; \$746.49 = cost of items/supplies;
 \$196.21 = Profit; Total fun value for kids and families = priceless.
 - Other major expenditures this past month: \$2,818.38 distributed so far for PAC Special Funding Programs for last year and this year; \$1,964.88 distributed so far to teachers out of their Gaming Grant allocations for their divisions; Gift for Grace Lore family (\$120 from PAC and \$45 in personal donations).

Overview of SD61Deficit

- 13-Apr <u>2021-22 Annual Budget Presentation</u> by SD61 Secretary-Treasurer, Kim Morris
- 7.1 m 2020-21 deficit

3,662,469 Decrease in Revenue 3,481,344 Increase in Expense \$7,143,813

 School boards must balance budget. SD61 has proposed savings and reinvestment strategies

District Balancing Strategies

Guiding Principles

- Every option must be examined
- All options are on the table
- Recognize lost opportunity and impact of savings strategies
- Prioritization
- Open to feedback before decisions are made

Proposed District Savings* (aka cuts)

- Administration impact: VP time reduced by 0.1 FTE/school
- Clerical in schools impact: 10.4 FTE
- Counsellors Shift cost from operating to Community Link impact: Nil but significant for George Jay

- Middle School Band impact: 11.74 FTE (reducing Grade 6/7 band to an exploratory block)
